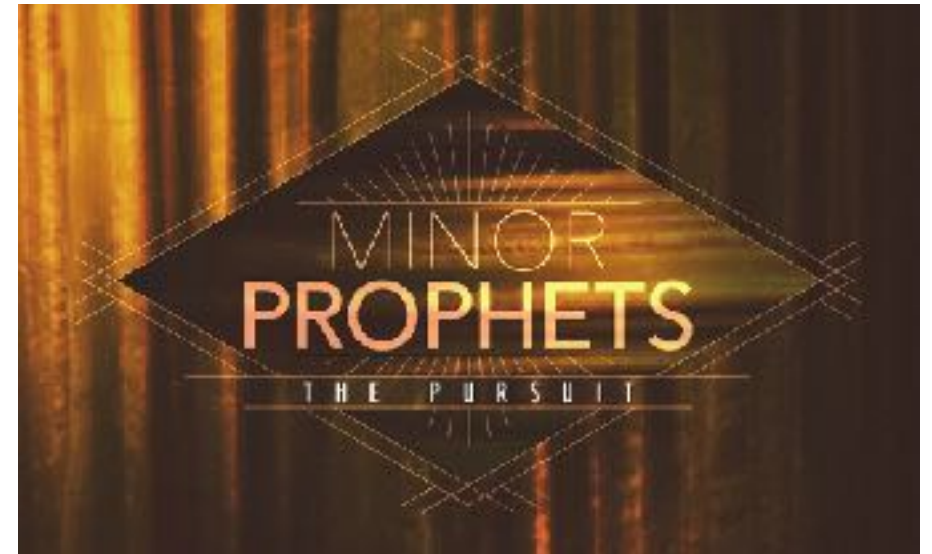

Minor Prophets: The Pursuit

Habakkuk 1 & 2

notes:

Take a moment to review the Bible verses and message notes from Sunday. What stands out to you as important or helpful as you reflect on those passages and what was said?

1. In verses 1:2-3, Habakkuk is crying out to God about His apparent lack of action. Recall a time in your life when you were asking or crying out, "How long...?" or "Why?" Discuss.
2. From your experience, describe a time when you thought God's justice was lagging behind what you believed was the proper timeline. Describe a time when the bad or "wicked" were seemingly rewarded, or at the very least, not punished for their wrongdoing. Compare & contrast other Biblical examples of this.
3. In verses 1:12-17, Habakkuk is shocked by God's response to his complaint found in verses 1:5-11. In short, Habakkuk wonders how this response was proper judgment & justice. Related to questions 1 & 2, recall a time that you are certain God heard your plea. Did He respond how you expected? Did God "shock" you with His answer? Discuss.
4. Even while being direct, notice how Habakkuk approaches God with his complaint; he appeals to God's nature & character (1:4; 12-13). In other words, Habakkuk is essentially saying, "God, because of who you are, help me understand..." When you go to God in prayer, do you appeal to Him in a humble, edifying way? What can you learn from how Habakkuk interacts with God?
5. Based on verses 2:3-4, what can we be sure of & how are we to live in the meantime?
6. Connected to question 5, consider verse 2:1. What are we to do while we wait & who shall we look to for answers? Is waiting on God difficult for you? In times of hurt and despair or when you lack understanding, do you seek answers and direction from sources other than God? Discuss.
