#### What is a covenant?

IN OUR DAY: A contract, a treaty, a will.

It defines the relationship, the promises and conditions involved in the covenant, and the consequences that will happen if the terms are not met.

Two types:

Unconditional

Is it contrary to clear biblical instruction?

Make your decision.
